CHRISTIAN JUSTICE MATTERS

There should be a difference between Christian

Justice and social Justice. I would define Christian Justice as "Justice based upon God's Word" as opposed to "social justice" defined by secular faulty thinking which more often results in harmful actions (Cf. Thomas Sowell <u>Social Justice Fallacies</u>). While studying the book of Ruth I gained a new insight about God's compassionate provision for the weakest members of society. Maomi became a widow as well as experiencing the death of her two sons. Widows without sons in

the ancient world would be destitute apart from God's provisions which includes the Law of gleaning (Lev.19.9f). Ruth, Naomi's faithful daughter in law, gleaned the fields of Boaz to help Naomi and herself to survive. Boaz's laborers told him that Ruth was a tireless worker only taking a few breaks through the long day as she worked to provide for herself and Maomi. Gleaning provided the destitute an opportunity to provide their needs by their own hands. God's provision of gleaning required the destitute by their toil to participate in God's provision for their needs.

The wisdom of God far outstretches human attempts to do the same things (again I point to Sowell). According to God's ordinance carried out in the book of Ruth, the best way to help people is to allow them to work at least a little for their daily needs. We ask people in need to come into the church, listen or participate in a worship service, and hear the Word of God. They put forth this effort. Friends from churches like Cornerstone, and Community in Owosso as well as Faith Rochester and others help provide food which gives us the opportunity to share God's generosity and grace.
